Exodus 1-4

DOES GOD KEEP HIS PROMISES? YES, GOD ALWAYS KEEPS HIS PROMISES BECAUSE HE IS FAITHFUL.

Joseph's family in Egypt grew. All the people in this family were known as Israelites. A new pharaoh was afraid of the Israelites. So Pharaoh made the Israelites slaves. Still, their families grew. So Pharaoh ordered for all their baby boys to be killed.

Around this time, a woman gave birth to a son. She put him in a basket and set it along the bank of the Nile River. Pharaoh's daughter found the baby and wanted the baby to be her son. The princess named the baby Moses.
